



### YARD SALES SIGNS—LET'S PICK THEM UP!

Nothing exemplifies the saying “One man’s trash is another man’s treasure” like a good old-fashioned yard sale. Yard sales are an American institution and a great way to earn some extra money, but they come with responsibilities. If you decide to hold a yard sale, please make sure you are in compliance with City of Henderson codes to avoid a possible citation.

Henderson Municipal Code 19.7.1 allows “Sales of personal property for a period of not more than three days every six months”. Signs advertising the sales, however, may not be “...attached to trees, telephone poles, public benches or streetlights, or placed on any public property or public right-of-way.” as set forth in HMC 19.11.2.

Old yard sale signs are a blight to our community. On windy days you may see them blowing down the street or piling up against fences. Boxes and rocks that have been placed in the median also remain. Monday mornings, Henderson Code Enforcement is often forced to spend valuable city resources collecting signs left from the weekend, resources that could be better spent on other projects. If one of the signs they pick up is yours, you may be subject to a fine.

If you are one of the many Henderson residents planning a yard sale— good luck! We hope that you make money and clean out your house, but please don't forget to be a responsible seller and comply with all applicable Henderson codes.
