Kodak American Greenways Awards

- The Kodak American Greenways Awards, administered by The Conservation Fund, a recognized leader in working with local communities to expand the nation's network of linked open spaces, provides small grants of up to \$2,500 to non-profit organizations and government agencies to help develop new action-oriented greenway projects. The Kodak Awards provide seed money to spark creativity in conservation, outdoor recreation, and trail and greenway development.
- According to the Conservation Fund President, Larry Selzer, "The projects selected this year represent some of the best grassroots conservation and greenway development efforts in the United States. The Fund supports these local initiatives because they are thoughtful, action-oriented projects that will serve as models for other communities around the country."
- The Kodak American Greenways Awards are made possible through the generous support of the Eastman Kodak Company. As the world's imaging leader, Kodak sets the standard in traditional picture taking, while working to bring the latest in digital imaging technologies to the marketplace. The Kodak American Greenway Awards Grants Review Committee consists of conservation experts from around the country. The committee selected grant recipients from a pool of nearly 300 qualified applicants.
- Since 1985 the Conservation Fund and its partners have permanently protected more than 4 million acres of important wildlife habitat, working landscapes, and recreation areas. For the fourth year in a row, the Fund was named the nation's top-rated environmental nonprofit by the American Institute of Philanthropy. With a one percent fundraising cost, the lowest of all environmental groups in the country, and a program allocation of 96 percent, the Fund is unmatched for its efficiency and effectiveness.
