

**CITY OF HENDERSON  
BICYCLE ADVISORY COMMITTEE  
MINUTES  
October 17, 2013**

**I. CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Richard Wimmer called the meeting to order at 4:03 p.m., in the Council Chambers Conference Room, 240 Water Street, Henderson, Nevada.

**II. CONFIRMATION OF POSTING AND ROLL CALL**

Mr. Jarvis, Project Engineer III, confirmed the meeting had been posted in accordance with the Open Meeting Law by posting the agenda three working days prior to the meeting at City Hall, Multigenerational Center, Whitney Ranch Recreational Center, and Fire Station No. 86.

### III. ACCEPTANCE OF AGENDA

(Motion) Mr. Floth introduced a motion to accept the agenda as presented. The vote favoring approval was unanimous. Chairman Wimmer declared the motion carried.

### IV. PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no comments presented by the public.

### V. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

#### a. Approval of the Minutes for August 15, 2013, and September 19, 2013.

(Motion) Mr. Seegmiller introduced a motion to approve the minutes of August 15, 2013, and September 19, 2013, as presented. The vote favoring approval was unanimous. Chairman Wimmer declared the motion carried.

#### b. Review of Bicycle Friendly Community Application and Assignments

Scott Jarvis, Project Engineer III, distributed copies of the updated application and noted that yellow items are items that are currently being worked on.

The Committee members reviewed the Bicycle Friendly Community Application and comments and assignments were made regarding the various questions.

##### *Question 85*

Chairman Wimmer suggested including the following: City has planned and developed numerous bike trails and facilities; community and City staff commitment and energy; and belief that the bicycle culture is beginning to mature.

Mr. Floth suggested connectivity between facilities should be mentioned as well.

Mr. Jarvis suggested that the partnerships that the City has, such as with the Regional Transportation Commission and the City of Las Vegas, might also be a reason that is highlighted.

Chairman Wimmer suggested that maps be attached to the application to help illustrate connectivity as well as other amenities.

Mr. Seegmiller also mentioned the leadership role that Henderson has in

the bicycling community.

*Question 86*

The following suggested answers were made by the Committee:

- connectivity
- more lanes and trails
- more public education
- the development of additional routes
- map of routes
- mileage markers on trails.
- additional bike racks for end users
- bike fix stations at trail heads
- promotion
- strategic partnerships

*Question 87*

Mr. Jarvis gave a summary of items that have already been identified and said he will be spending more time on this item. He said that once he has completed the question, the Committee can review and add their thoughts.

Chairman Wimmer commented that this item does not necessarily need to be based solely on funding alone.

Mr. Seegmiller suggested that the Committee look at other cities' applications to see how they have completed their answers as well as the League's responses.

*Question 88*

After discussion, the Committee suggested: "Yes, it has increased awareness and made us think about what other communities are doing that we can incorporate in our area."

Mr. Jarvis said he will incorporate the suggested changes and the Committee will review the application at the next meeting.

## **VI. NEW BUSINESS**

### **a. Chairman/Committee member discussion of ideas or questions on items that might improve the City's bicycling culture**

Responding to a question by Chairman Wimmer regarding progress on the Amargosa Trail project, Mr. Jarvis stated that the project was stopped due to the government shutdown; however, they just received notification today to resume work on the project.

**b. Staff Report**

**Staff update on City-sponsored initiatives and requests from Bicycle Advisory Committee**

Mr. Jarvis gave a summary of CicLAvia, which is an event he attended in Los Angeles. He said he received a lot of information and ideas from the event and noted that there were a large number of volunteers who assisted at the event.

Mr. Jarvis gave a brief wrap up of the Crazy Spokes event. He noted that approximately 150 riders participated and it was a great first event.

Mr. Jarvis said the City is gearing up for Stroll and Roll, which is scheduled to take place on November 9, 2013.

Responding to a question by Mr. Floth regarding bike corrals, Mr. Jarvis said free bike valet will be available.

Mr. Jarvis also noted that he was asked to make a presentation to the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) regarding this Committee and what they are working on. He said the CAC may be looking at ways they can assist the Bicycle Advisory Committee.

**VIII. PUBLIC COMMENT**

Bob Croak, no address given, thanked the City of Henderson for cleaning up the trails so quickly after the storms. He also commented that it is easy to get east and west via bicycle in the city, but not north and south.

**IX. CHAIRMAN/MEMBER COMMENTS**

There were no comments presented.
